# **Homeowner Education Programs**







### **OVERVIEW**

Homeowner education or counseling programs can provide a wide range of services and support. Some programs target first-time homebuyers, helping them understand the homebuying process including important financial considerations and tools for searching for and purchasing a home. Homeowner education or counseling services could include support for foreclosure prevention, financial literacy, counseling on reverse mortgages, or assistance and resources for homeowners who are, or are considering becoming, landlords. These programs are frequently provided by non-profits and often completion of such courses are requirements for below-market loans or participation in other housing financial support programs.



## POTENTIAL BENEFITS & CONSIDERATIONS

- Provides critical education about purchasing a home, helping prospective buyers understand the process and appropriately budget
- Programs are typically offered to participants for free so funding for them must be secured from a source other than participants
- An organization must have staff well-versed in the subject matter to provide the counseling or education
- Can provide information and support for people who may be struggling to maintain their home
- Lenders often require completion of such courses if offering financial assistance for homebuyers
