# Vision Zero Overview/ Safe System Approach

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
## What is the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Program?

- Federal grant program U.S. Department of Transportation – Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)
- **Goal:** Create a transportation system and mindset of users and its designers that eliminates all traffic related fatalities and substantially reduces serious crashes
- Includes: Funding Action Plans (up to \$10M) and Implementation (up to \$25M) grants
- Allows counties and municipalities to apply directly FHWA and not go through DOT and regional agencies





What is a Safe System Approach?





## The Safe System Approach

- **Safe Vehicles:** Vehicles are designed and regulated to minimize the frequency and severity of collisions using safety measures that incorporate the latest technology.
- **Safe Speeds:** Humans are less likely to survive high-speed crashes. Reducing speeds can accommodate human-injury tolerances: reducing impact forces, providing additional time for drivers to stop, and improving visibility.
- **Safe Roads:** Designing transportation infrastructure to accommodate human mistakes and injury tolerances can greatly reduce the severity of crashes that do occur.

## The Safe System Approach

- Post-Crash Care: People who are injured in collisions rely on emergency first responders to quickly locate and stabilize their injuries and transport them to medical facilities.
- **Safe Road Users:** Safety of all road users is equitably addressed, including those who walk, bike, drive, ride transit, or travel by other modes.



# Why is Vision Zero Important?

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




## 29,583 crashes were reported

Source: MassDOT: Crash Data Portal. Vulnerable user crashes related to infrastructure may not be included in the total crashes.






## 365 pedestrian crashes and 474 bicyclist crashes


